# District Director's Message:

## What we learned from a rosy windfall

Hello Rose Lovers,

Hope everyone had a safe and wonderful summer. What does one do when it is in the 100s-plus for consecutive days? Stay inside and get chores done. No, not house chores.

One project I have been working on is cleaning up my Rose Books. (Yes, I have five Rose Books that are divided by area, Front Yard, Back Yard, Behind Pool, etc.). They haven't been updated since 2012; in rose years, that is a long time. I did a lot of tossing old rose information and updating with new rose info. I do keep a Rose excel spreadsheet that is kept up to date. I have been enjoying this chore.

Thank you to Dave and Ruth Coop for being the delivery/coordinators and separators for the roses that (some) societies chose to receive from Jackson & Perkins. There were a few issues with the process. The first 100-plus roses sent to the Coops took over 10 days to get there. With the heat the nation was having, unfortunately the roses came in moldy and dead. Pictures were sent to J&P and, lo and behold, the Coops received 150 new bare root roses; shipped on a Monday and received on a Wednesday. Those were the ones that were distributed.

A brief history:

– J&P wanted to shut down their refrigerators. ARS President Diane Sommers worked with them on obtaining the roses.

– President Diane has asked for at least \$3/per rose for the ARS general funds. A motion will be on the table at the next business meeting for approval. The NCNH Board has approved the funds of \$500 and it has been sent in already.

– NCNH was not the only district that received roses. NCNH received 150 roses of three different types.

– If a society is still interested in obtaining a few, I do have extras that have been potted up. Contact me. First come first served.

What ARS/J&P/Districts learned from the process and will be further looked at:

– For the West Coast, need bare roots earlier in season.

– Some roses are taking a lot longer to have growth – once again, not just NCNH.

– Some districts used the roses as a money maker for their societies/district.

– Not sure if this will continue or get other growers involved.

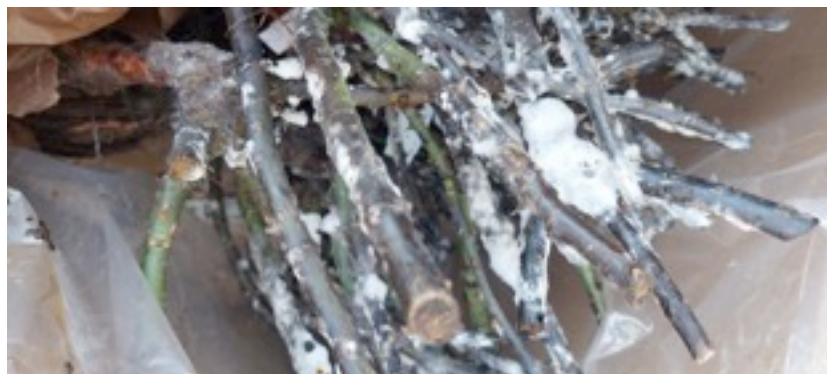

## The American Rose Society 2024 National Convention and Rose Show 'Sailing on a Sea of Roses'

Last month, I attended the ARS 2024 National Convention and Rose Show in Warwick, Rhode Island. I had judged several of these national rose shows in the past and this one was taking place in the very spot where my husband Paul had two sisters and their families. So, the trip was planned for a dual purpose – I wanted to judge this rose show and we wanted to plan a family reunion in Rhode Island. I registered for the Convention, placing an X in the box saying I was available to judge Horticulture. Then I set out to make the hotel and airplane reservations. This was months ago, but we were starting the process of getting there! Very exciting!

ARS National Rose Shows are so grand! You get to see gorgeous roses the likes of which you may have never seen before as there are many top notch exhibitors. Plus, there are several National Challenge Classes that only occur in at a National Show. A National convention is great fun with many interesting programs, a marketplace full of rosy merchandise, and lunches, happy hours, and banquets. It is similar to a District Rose Show and Convention, but bigger. Just a couple weeks before the convention, I got the email saying I was selected to judge. Loved that! There were 9 teams of 3 judges each just for Horticulture, plus other teams for judging Arrangements and Photographs. A person well known to us, Baldo Villegas, was rose show co-chair along with Jacqui Nye, who is from Rhode Island. They did a great job! Baldo was there for weeks before the show and for another week or so afterwards. Here is my judging team plus a couple photos of Baldo and Jacqui at the show.

So, the first half of our 8 days in Rhode Island was spent at the convention hotel in Warwick and the last half visiting with family, mostly at their beach houses/cabanas/beach clubs. But, about the show... I was teamed with two women judges (see above), one from New Jersey (where I grew up!) and one from Connecticut. After the judges breakfast, we walked into the show and wow, so many roses!

Some show highlights for me were as follows. The big National Challenge, the Nickolson Perpetual Challenge Bowl, an entry of 9 Hybrid Teas and/or Grandifloras, one bloom per stem, each at exhibition stage, each of a different variety, exhibited in separate containers, is always a sight to behold! Each one is capable of being Queen! I show one entry below. My other favorite National Challenge is the Benjamin Williams Miniflora Rose Challenge, comprised of 10 Miniflora roses, one bloom per stem, each at exhibition stage, either one each of different varieties, or 2 each of 5



varieties. I loved the one with two blooms of 5 varieties. It is also shown below. The Queen of Show was the Hybrid Tea 'Sunny Sundays' which was shown by the hybridizer himself, John Smith! Now that is something that you don't see... The King was 'Marilyn Monroe'. I think the Princess was one called 'My Lady Barbara', a pink and white, but not sure about this. I took many photos but not all had their tags or certificates showing in my photos and this was one of them. The Best Novice entry was a beautiful spray of 'Celestial Nights' which also won King of Floribundas (Silver Certificate). What a day for that Novice! One of my Judging team won Best Judges entry with a beautiful bloom of 'Moonstone'.

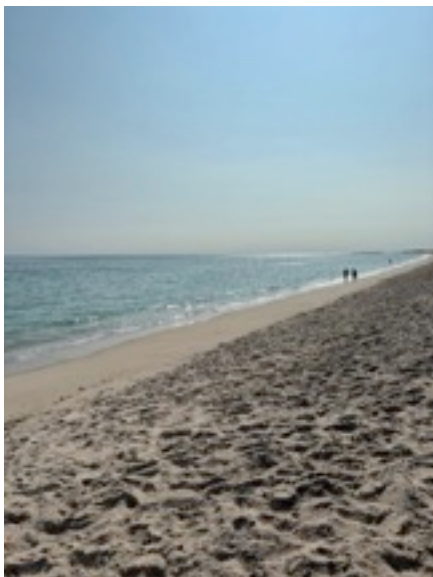

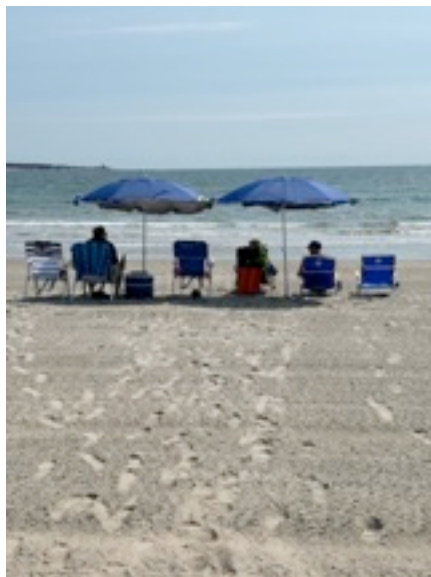
Loved this arrangement Lou Evans' winning photo My judging partner's win Dedicated writer of certificates

Our NCNH district website lists all of our ARS Horticulture judges. The two judging schools held November 4 and 5, 2023, and on April 24, 2024, enabled all inactive judges the opportunity to become current as to their status. We have 36 judges, one of whom is inactive, plus five apprentice judges. Judges' status on NCNH website reflects status as of August 11, 2024.

The Wednesday, April 24, 2024 ARS Horticulture Judging School was held at the home of Jolene Adams, Regional Director, in Rio Vista, Calif. Instruction in the morning, a wonderful potluck lunch, and candidates took both the written exam and practical exam in the afternoon.

Instructors were well-prepared and brought specimens to share and use for the practical exam.

Faculty included Judy Frederick, Judging Ethics; Jan Burnham, Anatomy, Phrases, Disqualification & Penalization; Judy Frederick, Point Scoring & the Prime Elements of Judging; Lesa Lane, Judging Hybrid teas and Grandifloras; Barbara Gordon, Judging Sprays, Floribundas, Polyanthas, Shrubs, and OGRs; Jolene Adams, Judging Miniatures and Minifloras; and Judy Frederick, Judging Challenge Classes, Collections, and Courts of Honor. On the team setting up the practical exam was Eileen Jackson.

**Interview with**  
**Ed and Mary Anne Kreutzer**  
Myrtle Point, OR  
South Western Oregon Rose  
Society

One of the pleasures I have when judging horticulture entries at any local rose show in our NCNH District is meeting members and seeing roses different from ones I grow. On June 22 this year, fellow judge Sue Magill and I traveled to Myrtle Point, OR to judge South Western Oregon Rose Society's local show. SW Oregon Rose Society is the newest local society to become part of Northern California–Nevada–Hawaii (NCNH) District. We enjoyed visiting and staying at the home of Ed and Mary Anne Kreutzer. Their roses were amazing, and I asked for this interview.

**Discuss who you are and where you live.**

We are Ed and Mary Anne Kreutzer. We have been married since 1968. We have two adult children, three grandchildren and one great-grandchild. We live in Myrtle Point, Oregon in the Southwest part of the state.

**How did you find your local rose society?**

We heard a PSA, about the Christmas Party for the Southwestern Oregon Rose Society, in December of 1981. The rest is history.

**What motivates you to be President, Ed?**

It's a good way to provide leadership and motivate other society members. I encourage our members to try new things. One example is we planted and provide care for a rose garden at our local county fairgrounds. We also hold two or three rose and plant sales each year. One thing I am really proud of is getting our society transferred from the Pacific NW to the NCNH District. With the help of Jolene Adams and Sue Bennett, that was made possible.

**What other offices have either of you held?**



Ed has been President several times, vice president, and rose show chairman. He has also been in charge of coordinating rose orders for the society. Mary Anne has also been president, vice president, secretary, and refreshment chair.

**What is your local climate, soil, water, and other growing conditions like?**

Our temperatures average 80° in the summer and around 50° in the winter. We usually get a few days over 100° in the summer and a few days below freezing in the winter. Our soil is mostly clay, and we have added humus and sand over the years. Our water comes from a farm pond that has cows, wild ducks, frogs, etc. It does seem to have some natural fertilizer in it. The biggest problem is that it is so dirty, we cannot use drip systems or even soaker hoses. Plugs them right up, so we do all of our watering with a hose.

**What kind of roses, and how many are you growing this year?**

We grow about 800 plants. Everything from climbers to miniatures. We also have a large number of shrubs, and a few hybrid musks, rugosas and other OGR's.

**What was the first rose you grew, and do you have particular favorites?**

Ed's mom gave us 'Love', 'Honor', and 'Cherish' for Christmas the year they were AARS roses (1980). It kind of grew out of hand from there. We started buying roses at nurseries and through our local rose society. In the 1980's and 1990's, our rose society would place large orders with Weeks, Edmonds, Arena, Hortico and other rose suppliers. We then made them available to our members at \$1.00 over cost. It was a good deal for the members and the rose society. It helped our treasury and brought in new members. Mary Anne's favorites are 'Double Delight' and 'Memorial Day'.





Ed's favorite is whichever one he is looking at, at the time. He really likes 'Silver Jubilee' and 'Love and Peace'.

**When did you get interested in propagation?**

Mary Anne used to go to other members yards when they were pruning and took cuttings. Many of our roses were obtained that way. We have several varieties from Hortico, and many older roses that are no longer in commerce. I wanted to make them available to other rosarians, so I started to make cuttings.

**Any tips for success?**

Water is the key. When the cuttings start to send out roots, if they dry out, you have lost that cutting. I put my cuttings in one gallon size pots and keep them in solid plastic trays that I keep filled with water. I can also add fungicide to the water and the pots wick the solution up into the pot. **Tell us about your sports and hybridization efforts.**

I have not done any hybridizing yet but may do so in the future. I discovered a sport on a bush of 'Escapade' that has white veining throughout the flower. I call this 'Lilac Lace'. I also have a sport of 'Be-Bop' that opens orange, ages to pink, and keeps the yellow eye. I call this one 'Bo Peep'. I also discovered a seedling growing in the lawn and propagated it. I believe it is a cross of 'Candy Mountain' and 'Appleblossom Flower Carpet'. I named this one 'Candy Apple'.

**What are you looking for in a rose you purchase?**

We want it to be vigorous, have good form, color, and disease resistance. We also tend to like unusual roses, such as striped, hand-painted and unusual color combinations. In a hybrid tea, I want it to have the traditional form. I do not care for the hybrid tea roses that have so many petals that is called a decorative form.

**How do you decide to shovel prune and remove a rose from your collection?**

We have shovel pruned roses that are disease magnets or just don't perform. If we have a rose that is not doing well, we will move it to another spot in the garden and evaluate it before digging it up and discarding.

**What other plants do you especially enjoy having in your garden, your orchard, or elsewhere on your property?**

We grow a number of annuals and perennials. We have a variety of snapdragon that is multicolored and reseeds itself. We also grow several colors of phlox, daisies, penstemon, verbena, lilies, rhododendrons, alstroemeria, and dahlias. We like perennials because we don't have to replace them every year. We also grow several varieties of apple, pear, plum and peach trees. We have eight different kinds of berries, and a vegetable garden.

**Do you have time for any other hobbies? What are they?**

Mary Anne loves to preserve food. She cans, dehydrates, and has a freeze dryer. We also have four freezers. Mary Anne has made rose hip jelly, either alone or combined with apple juice. She has also made potpourri and rose petal brandy.

Ed has raised and shown poultry since his high school days, and has shown at local, state, and national poultry shows. He also hunts for deer and elk and gathers several kinds of wild berries.

**What tips would you like to share with a beginning rosarian?**

Talk to local rose growers. There is so much to learn about rose culture, they are your best resource. Don't buy a rose based on the picture alone. Talk to local people who grow the rose before you invest your money.

**What knowledge would you impart to a more seasoned rosarian such as a Consulting Rosarian or an ARS Horticulture or ARS Arrangement Judge?**

Over the last 40 years or so, we have had roses disqualified at rose shows because the judges were not familiar with the variety. I realize that judges cannot know every rose, and I don't expect them to. But exhibitors are knowledgeable also. I think judges should ask the exhibitor to verify the exhibit before it is disqualified.

"If you do not want to commit to the work, time or expense of rose growing, find yourself another hobby."

**Your additional thoughts please.**

Water, water, water. I can't say it enough. Another trick I have learned as I get older and my prayer bones complain more, is using a propane torch to weed my rose beds. I have been doing this for three years now, and it is very successful. I would also like to thank Judy Frederick for taking the time and energy to do this article.

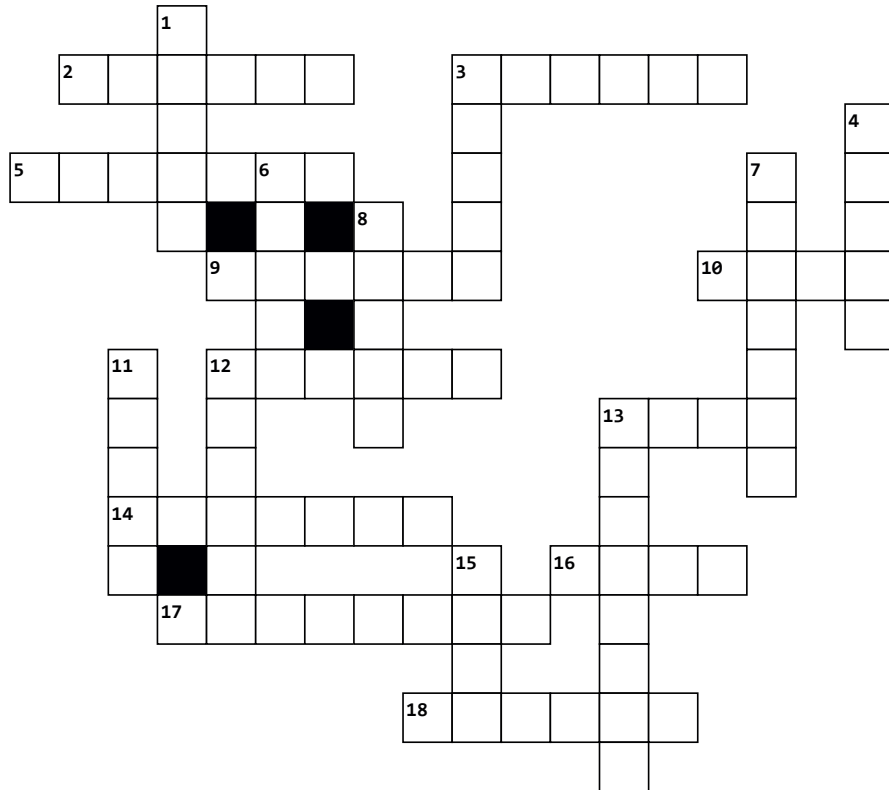

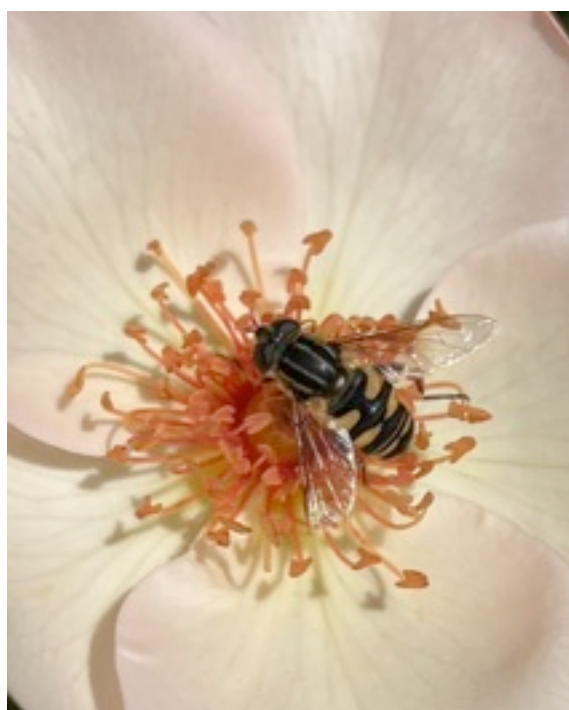

# Luis Desamero: Passing of A Rose Legend

Luis Tuico Desamero passed away peacefully on Aug. 13 at his home in Studio City, California. He was born in the Philippines in May 1937 and emigrated to the USA as a young student where he trained formally as a professional accountant.

Known as a beloved, ionic personality for his many accomplishments in both the American Rose Society and the World Federation of Rose Societies, he was awarded several Gold Medals for his volunteer services to the advancement of rose education. He traveled internationally to lecture, to demonstrate and to enter competitively in rose shows from his own garden of 1,000 plants.

He had seven brothers and one sister. Only his sister, Melma Jean, survives living in Windsor, Ontario, Canada. He is survived by his lifetime partner of 52 years, Dr. Thomas Cairns.

He is to be cremated on Aug. 23 at Rose Hills Mortuary, Whittier, California where he served as co-Chair of the Permanent Judging Panel of the International Rose Trials for 25 years. Funeral services will be private.

Donations may be made to the Educational Endowment Trust of the American Rose Society in his honor. A celebration of life is planned at a later date.

However, our revenue from these sources does not come in equal amounts from month

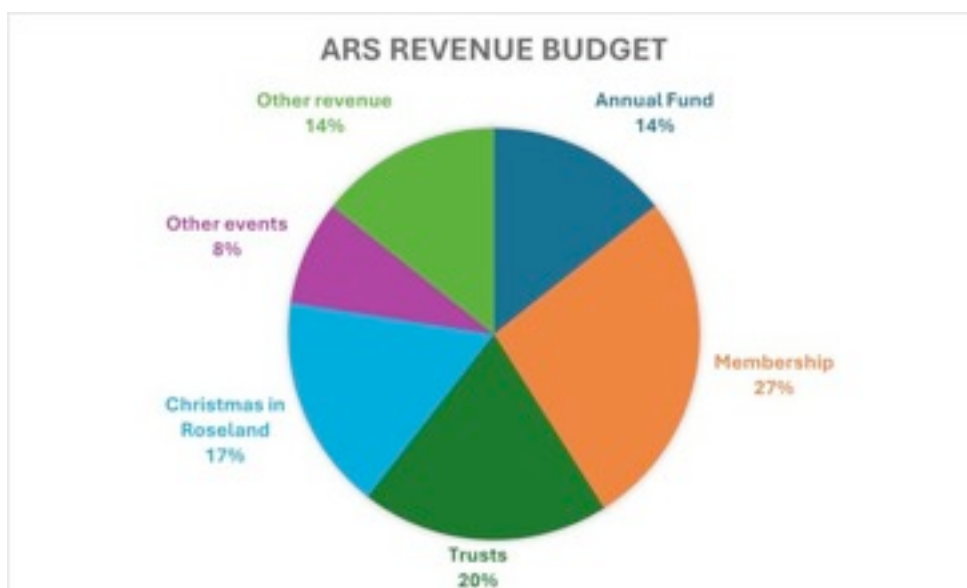

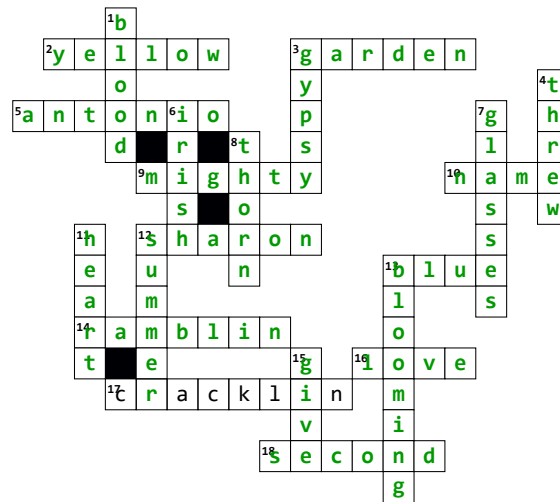
